Reader 4	Matthew 12:15-21	Many followed him, and he healed all their sick...This was to fulfill what was spoken through the prophet Isaiah:

Audience		<i>Here is my servant whom I have chosen, the one I love, in whom I delight; I will put my Spirit on him, and he will proclaim justice to the nations. He will not quarrel or cry out; no one will hear his voice in the streets. A bruised reed he will not break, and a smoldering wick he will not snuff out, till he leads justice to victory. In his name the nations will put their hope.</i>
Band Member	Luke 4:41	Moreover, demons came out of many people, shouting, "You are the Son of God!" But he rebuked them and would not allow them to speak, because they knew he was the Christ.
Band Member	Matthew 8:16b-17	...he drove out the spirits with a word and healed all the sick. This was to fulfill what was spoken through the prophet Isaiah: "He took up our infirmities and carried our diseases."
Band Member	Matthew 14:18b-19a, 20a, 21	...looking up to heaven, he gave thanks and broke the loaves. Then...the disciples gave them to the people. They all ate and were satisfied...The number of those who ate was about five thousand men, besides women and children.

Audience read silently	Matthew 27:28-29, 37,39-40, 42-43, 46	They stripped him and put a scarlet robe on him, and then twisted together a crown of thorns and set it on his head. They put a staff on his right hand and knelt in front of him and mocked him: "Hail, king of the Jews!" they said. Above his head they placed the written charge against him: "This is Jesus, the King of the Jews". Those who passed by hurled insults at him: "You who are going to destroy the temple and built it in three days, save yourself! Come down from the cross, if you are the Son of God!" "He saved others but he can't save himself." "He's the King of Israel! Let him come down now from the cross, and we will believe in him." "He trusts in God. Let God rescue him now if he wants him, for he said: 'I am the Son of God.'" About the ninth hour Jesus cried out in a loud voice, "Eloi, Eloi, lama sabachthani?"—which means, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

Audience read silently	John 19:30b; Matthew 27:51,54c	Jesus said: " It is finished ". With that, he bowed his head and gave up his spirit...At that moment the curtain of the temple was torn in two from top to bottom. The earth shook and the rocks split...They were terrified and exclaimed: "Surely, he was the Son of God!"
All 4 Readers	Hebrews 10:19-23	Therefore, brothers, since we have confidence to enter the Most Holy Place by the blood of Jesus, by a new and living way opened for us through the curtain, that is, his body,
Audience		and since we have a great priest over the house of God, let us draw near to God with a sincere heart in full assurance of faith,
